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DIRECTOR'S NOTES

I love the theatre. It's where I've spent my adult life, exploring fascinating people and ideas, and forging community with creative teams of talented artists, and dedicated audience members. Theatre of course does not exist without an intrepid audience, willing to brave the dark and a room of mostly strangers, and sit together for an hour or more voyaging into brave new worlds. It is an adventure, and a mystery, which has, since its inception, gone to the heart of what it means to be human and living in this world.

Welcome to our current adventure! From a Victorian dinner party gone hilariously wrong, to a brutal dystopian sewer-scape, Cinched/Strapped explores resilience, power, rebellion and gender across history and into the future. I'm so excited to be delving into the words and imagination of playwright Selina Fillinger, whose work teems with

verbal virtuosity, theatrical verve, and a questing spirit.

Fillinger prefaces the first of *The Armor Plays, Cinched* (set in Victorian England), with the powerful statement of noted philosopher and revolutionary, Frantz Fanon:

"We revolt simply because for many reasons we can no longer breathe"

Cinched's corsets, are central to the metaphor of unjust power structures restricting the breathing room of the oppressed. The corset is one of the most controversial garments in the cultural history of fashion. As a restrictive apparatus, the corset is viewed as a means by which patriarchal society controlled women and exploited their sexuality. As Leigh Summers

points out in her book <u>Bound to Please</u> (2001), the corset paradoxically sexualizes the female body, while containing it and constraining it. Historically, corsets were a leading cause of fainting fits, uterine failure and severe abdominal damage. If you can't breathe, it's hard to run, to eat, to be strong. Yet, when we threw off the corsets, did we become free? There has been progress, but how much?

The second of *The Armor Plays, Strapped*, presents a dystopian future world, where women have been driven underground by a power structure which has severely restricted reproductive rights. It is part of a current proliferation of plays, novels, movies and television written by women reflecting a growing preoccupation among writers with the tenuous status of women's rights, and the pervasive fear that progress toward equality between the sexes and social progress has stalled or may be reversed. The lenses of these feminist dystopian works project current concerns onto the future, and also reflect the past and the present.

Since we began rehearsals for this play, there has been a spike in news about men exerting control over women's bodies. In Alabama- 25 white men and one white woman passed the most restrictive anti-abortion legislation of my lifetime. It would outlaw all abortions except in cases where the mother's life is in danger- even rape and incest. A doctor would face 99 years in jail for performing an abortion. Governors in Kentucky, Mississippi, Ohio and Georgia have recently approved bans on abortion once a fetal heartbeat

is detected, which can happen in the sixth week of pregnancy, before many women know they're pregnant. Missouri lawmakers passed an eight-week ban. Other states, including Louisiana and Texas, are considering similarly restrictive laws. Make no mistake- laws against abortion do not prevent abortions. They force them underground. These laws disproportionately affect people of color, and people of the middle and lower class.

Cinched is prefaced with a quote from Simone de Beauvoir on the project of feminism.

"The point is not for women simply to take power out of men's hands, since that wouldn't change anything about the world. It's a question precisely of destroying that notion of power"

For myself, this demands that we take a hard look at our current social structures and power relations, and question whether we are creating a world that is sustainable or even desirable. Can we move away from constructs of domination and victimization, toward models built on collaboration and support? Current scientific and sociological thought has moved away from Darwinian ideas of "survival of the fittest", toward a recognition that the true survivors in evolution depend on ideas that stress the interdependence of life, kindness and generosity.

A brave new world, indeed- but one we need to consider making, together.


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


