## ABOUT THE ACTORS

ESTER RAGLAND (Maxine) is one of Theatre Three's original founders. Her roles have ranged from the society matron in SABRINA FAIR (for which she won the coveted "Billy" award) to the tragic mother in SIX CHARACTERS IN SEARCH OF AN AUTHOR.

HUGH FEAGIN (Shannon) is making his debut on the arena stage with this portrayal of Shannon. Mr. Feagin studied at the University of Texas and went on to professional work at the Shakespeare theatre in Stratford, Conn. He appeared on Broadway with Gladys Cooper in A PASSAGE TO INDIA.

ELEANOR BERMAN (Hannah) has been acting with Theatre Three since THE HOSTAGE in which she played the comedy role of Miss Ghilchrist. She was also seen in the prize winning one act drama, TO GETTYSBURG.

MAE WESTBROOK (Miss Fellows) has had a long association with Theatre Three beginning with the hit play of the first season, BORN YESTERDAY. Since then Miss Westbrook has lent her comic talents to SABRINA FAIR and MRS. McTHING as well as creating two roles written especially for her in children's shows in the theatre's PINWHEEL THEATRE.

CLAY NEWTON (Nonno) is Theatre Three's veteran character player.Mr. Newton's most celebrated performance was in a recent production of THE CARETAKER He has also played comedy roles of importance including Ol' Cap'n in the production of PURLIE VICTORIOUS.

JAC ALDER (Hank), another of Theatre Three's original founders, has appeared in numerous roles including the title role in THE HOSTAGE, Carelton in LIGHT UP THE SKY, and the director in SIX CHARACTERS IN SEARCH OF AN AUTHOR. He is a winner of a "Billy" award for his performance in DON JUAN IN HELL.

CAROL McKINLEY (Charlotte Goodall) has appeared in THE NEW DRUNKARD, ALL THE WAY HOME and in the prize winning one-act, ROCKABYE CHARLIE.

Premiere performers in this production include Mr. Adolph Canales as Pancho. Mr. Canales is an SMU graduate with a degree in political science. He is fluent in English Spanish and French. Mr. Ivan Olivera, who plays Pedro, is a native of Buenas Aires who has lived in Dallas for four years.

For Mr. Hughes, appearing as Jake Latta, this is his first appearance with Theatre 3, although he has been active on the Dallas stages for several years. Mr. Howard Ware who plays Herr Fahrenkoph is really more at home behind the strings of a banjo, entertaining a variety of audiences from shut-ins to folk singing gad-abouts.

Mlles. Donna Vivian, Paula Vivian and Pat Hale are numbered amoung Theatre Three's loyal backstage workers and are making their initial appearances as the German daughters.
