


# John Bucchino

John Bucchino's songs have been performed and recorded by renowned pop (Art Garfunkel, Judy Collins), theatre (Liza Minnelli, Patti LuPone, Kristin Chenoweth, Brian Stokes Mitchell, Audra McDonald), cabaret (Barbara Cook, Michael Feinstein), and classical artists (Yo-Yo Ma, Deborah Voight, Nathan Gunn), as well as The Boston Pops, the Los Angeles Philharmonic and the Mormon Tabernacle Choir in venues including Carnegie Hall, The Metropolitan Opera, The Hollywood Bowl, The Sydney Opera House, London's O2 Arena and The White House.

He's written scores for the musicals Urban Myths, Lavender Girl, Broadway's A Catered Affair (winner of the Drama League Award for Best Musical), It's Only Life, and the Dreamworks animated film Joseph, King of Dreams, and lyrics for the children's musical Simeon's Gift (with a book by Julie Andrews and Emma Walton Hamilton). Some recordings of his work are: Grateful, The Songs of John Bucchino (with companion songbook), Solitude Lessons, On Richard Rodgers' Piano (solo piano interpretations of Rodgers' songs on the composer's own Steinway, voted Best Instrumental CD by Show Business Weekly), and the cast albums of It's Only Life (with companion songbook) and A Catered Affair. As part of their Julie Andrews Collection, Harper Collins published a children's book, based on John's song, called Grateful A Song of Giving Thanks which was awarded the Parents' Choice Gold Award.

# **Harvey Fierstein**

Mr. Fierstein made his professional acting debut at La Mama ETC in 1971 in Andy Warhol's only play, Pork. He followed that with appearances in more than 60 off-off Broadway productions including work with The Playhouse of the Ridiculous, Negro Ensemble Company, WPA, and Theater Genesis. In Boston he starred in The Haunted Host, Dirtiest Show In Town and Madness Of Lady Bright, Mr. Fierstein began his playwrighting career with early plays like Flatbush Tosca, Cobra Jewels, Freaky Pussy, International Stud, Fugue In A Nursery, and Widows and Children First. His underground hit, Torch Song Trilogy opened off-off Broadway in 1980, transferred to Off-Broadway in 1981, and then to Broadway in 1982, where it won the Best Play Tony Award as well as Drama Desk, Obie and Dramatist Guild awards. Fierstein also won Tony, Drama Desk, and Theater World acting awards for his portrayal of the lead. Harvey repeated his award winning performance in Los Angeles and London. Fierstein won his third Tony Award for the libretto of the musical La Cage aux Folles in 1984. His other plays include Safe Sex, Spookhouse, Forget Him, A Catered Affair, and Legs Diamond. His television work includes Nurse Jackie, How I Met Your Mother, Family Guy, and The Simpsons. He was nominated for an Emmy for his work on the TV classic, Cheers. Films include Mrs. Doubtfire, Independence Day, Death to Smoochy, Bullets Over Broadway, and Showtime's Common Ground (which he also wrote). His children's book, The Sissy Duckling is published by Simon & Schuster and the HBO film version won him the Humanitas Prize. Fierstein's starring role as Edna Turnblad in the musical Hairspray won him his fourth Tony Award as well as another Drama Desk Award, New York Magazine Award and the Drama League Award for Outstanding Performance of

the Year. This made him the first person in history to win Tonys as an actor as well as a writer on both the dramatic and musical sides of the theaterworld. In 2005 Harvey spent a triumphant year on Broadway as Tevye in a critically acclaimed production of Fiddler on the Roof, and then reprised the role in 2009 and 2010 on tour across America. Fierstein was inducted into the Theater Hall of Fame in 2008. As a social and political commentator. Harvey's opinion pieces and essays have been featured as "Outtakes" on the TV series In the Life, and on the Op-Ed page of The New York Times, among other publications.

#### **ARTISTIC STAFF**

Jac Alder DIRECTOR » Mr. Alder serves Theatre Three as Executive Producer-Director. He is a co-founder (in 1961) of Theatre Three, following the leadership of his late wife, Norma Young. Jac directed and designed Lost in the Stars, Amy's View, 33 Variations, Travesties and most recently See What I Wanna See. Additionally, he has also either directed or designed many shows on both stages. His other

duties include heading the administrative and financial team of the theatre, selecting repertoire, and working in the community and in Texas for the promotion of the arts. In this latter capacity, he served on the board of Texas Non-Profit Theatres, is a founding and continuing member of the Advisory Board of the Arts Magnet High School, is on the KERA Advisory Board, and, through the Dallas Area Cultural Advocacy Coalition, is a member of the 2011 Advisory Committee for Dallas Arts Advocacy Day. He is supported in the mission of Theatre Three by many artists, a hard-working and dedicated staff, and the energies of the theatre's generous and inventive Board of Directors His thanks to all, and to all of Theatre Three's playgoers, he extends his usual admonition: "Enjoy yourselves!"

Vonda K. Bowling MUSICAL DIRECTOR » Ms. Bowling has been a musical resource for T3 since 2008 and this will be her tenth production. Past shows include: The Drowsy Chaperone, Blankity-Blank, Songs From an Unmade Bed. I Love You, You're

Perfect, Now Change (x2), A Dog's Life (Column Award Nomination), The Light in the Piazza. Lost in the Stars (DFW Theatre Critics Forum Award), The 25th Annual Putnam County Spelling Bee, and Another Night Before Christmas. She is the co-founder of Dallas Young Artists and is the Middle and Upper School Choir Director at Greenhill School, Vonda lives in Rowlett with husband Jeffrey and their two sons, Harrison and Mason.

David Walsh SET DESIGN » Mr. Walsh joined our staff in 2007 as Technical Director and is a man of many talents. David's set designs have been seen in House & Garden, The Light in the Piazza, Pygmalion and A Dog's Life on the Norma Young Arena Stage and in Songs of the Redhead: The Music of Danny Kaye, Snake in the Grass, Look What's Happened to Pixie DeCosta, Blind Date, Season's Greetings, The LaVidas' Landlord, and Mid-Life, the Crisis Musical in Theatre Too. Prior to this, he lived in Amarillo, TX, where he was the Assistant Technical Director and Scenic Designer/Artist for Amarillo

Little Theatre (ALT). David was on the design team responsible for the design and execution of more than 80 productions in his eight years with ALT. Along with his design responsibilities, he also appeared in a number of productions: Gross Indecency (Oscar Wilde), Big River (King), A Funny Thing Happened on the Way to the Forum (Miles Gloriosus), and the Lonesome West (Valene). David resides in Dallas and has three children.

Michael Robinson COSTUME DESIGN » Mr. Robinson's recent assignments at Theatre Three include See What I Wanna See, and after The Roads to Home, The Drowsy Chaperone; prior credits are The Royal Family, Bedroom Farce, Bill W. & Dr. Bob, Defiance, The Light in the Piazza and Lost in the Stars. He has designed many shows for Contemporary Theatre of Dallas, Coppell Community Theatre, CrossRoads Theatre, Garland Civic Theatre, Garland Summer Musicals, Kauffman Civic Theatre, Lyric Stage, Irving; Uptown Players, Dallas; and WaterTower Theatre, Addison. His Awards include

Best Costume Shop, Dallas Observer; Best Costumes for *Old Settler*, Dallas/ Ft. Worth Critics Forum Awards; and the Rabin Award for Best Costumes in a Play or Musical.

Sam Nance LIGHTING DESIGN » This is Mr. Nance's fourth assignment with Theatre Three as lighting designer, having previously designed The Light in the Piazza, The Goodbye Girl and A Dog's Life. In the Metroplex area, Sam designed lights for Shakespeare for the Modern Man - Lesson 1: Macbeth. The Pirates of Penzance and Dracula for Irving Community Theater, Mainstage; is the resident lighting designer for Pegasus Theatre, where he has lit their innovative "living black and white" shows as well as their more colorful presentations, and has also designed lighting for Dallas Theater Center, Shakespeare Festival of Dallas, and Theatre Britain, Outside of Dallas, he designed lights for the Lois Pope Theater, Manalapan, Florida. In 2002, Terry arranged John's song "Grateful" for the Turtle Creek Chorale, an arrangement which TCC shared with another chorus, John Bucchino somehow heard and admired it. Thus began a contact between Terry and John which resulted in getting John's permission for Terry to devise a revue of the composer's works we staged in Theatre Too (in the 2004-2005 season) appropriately enough titled Grateful: The Songs of John Bucchino.

Putting together a revue of song writers' works recalls the many times. Theatre Three devised revues staged here (some of which went out on tour) including S'Wonderful and Clap Yo' Hands celebrating the Gershwins; Jeepers Creepers, Here's Harry celebrating movie composer Harry Warren; Yip Yip Hooray celebrating Yip, Harburg; Weill Women celebrating Kurt Weill; Rise & Shine celebrating Irving Berlin and Porter, Please celebrating Cole Porter.

Our production of *Grateful*: The Songs of John Bucchino was well before the Broadway show A Catered Affair, and before the international success of Bucchino's self-devised revue. It's Only

Life. As one of the first companies to secure the rights to A Catered Affair, we decided our 50th Anniversary Season was a great time to do both these new Bucchino shows, AND a personal cabaret performance by the maestro himself, in a special spotlight in a one night only performance in Theatre Too on November 17. 




# I'm finding my place at a Dallas Community College
