Exotic Dancing with Ronnie Claire Edwards & Candy Barr

Like most of Ronnie Claire Edwards' characters, the women in Candy Barr's Last Dance have colorful lives, have seen their share of troubles, and exist at the edges of "polite society." They pique our interest because we don't often hear directly from characters like these-they're more often the supporting characters who add theatrical flair to stories about their more conventional sisters. However, Edwards' gift is that she does not allow us to come to her plays simply to 'gawk at the exotic'; time spent with them leaves us as aware of their humanity as their eccentricities.

Although the trio we actually meet in the play are fictional, Candy Barr herself was a real person. Born Juanita Dale Slusher, she left her small Texas town, Edna, to escape abuse and wound up in Dallas, where she eventually became one of the most famous burlesque and striptease dancers in the city. She started out as a cigarette girl at Barney Weinstein's Theatre Lounge at the age of 17. gave exotic dancing a try on amateur night, and was soon a headliner at both of Weinstein's clubs under her new name: Candy Barr. A true Texan, Candy Barr's costume was cowboy boots, two pearl-handled six-shooters in a holster around her hips ... and not much else.

Candy Barr's scandalous life included posing for many of the famous pin-up magazines of the era (including Playboy); shooting one of her four husbands (when he broke down her apartment door); being arrested twice and spending time in prison near Huntsville, Texas on charges

of marijuana possession; becoming a "gangster's moll" when she began dating the infamous Mickey Cohen (and then having to testify against him in court); and the friendship with Jack Ruby that got her interviewed by the FBI after Ruby killed Lee Harvey Oswald.

This is where Ronnie Claire Edwards found her inspiration. Due to her penchant for the denizens of the demi-monde, what attracted her notice amongst all the material produced in recognition of the soth anniversary of Kennedy's assassination last year was the tidbit about the strippers in Jack Ruby's life who were rounded up and interrogated in the aftermath of the tragedy. She kept wondering what that experience was like for them; Candy Barr's Last Dance is the result of her musings.

Candy Barr retired quietly back to Edna in the 1990s. and she died in 2005. She left behind a daughter, a granddaughter, and a book of poems she'd written in prison. There are YouTube videos on the internet of her dancing, and 1 will confess to having watched them (in the name of research, mind you!). In the interest of propriety, I doubt my bosses at Theatre Three will sanction my providing the links for you, so in this case, you're just going to have to do your own...ahem...dirty work.

In the meantime, please enjoy the world premiere of Candy Barr's Last Dance.

PLAYWRIGHT

Ronnie Claire Edwards is an accomplished actress, author and playwright. She is perhaps best known for her portrayal of the unforgettable Corabeth Godsey on The Waltons which ran for ten years on television. She was also a regular on a number of television series and she had a recurring role on Designing Women, as well as guest appearances on major television series. Her film credits include All the Wav Home, Nobody's Fool, The 34th Star, Perfect, The Dead

Pool, When Every Day Was the Fourth of July, UFO Cafe, and 8 Seconds.

An Oklahoma native, Miss Edwards began her career at the Margo Jones Theatre where she won a Protégée Award. She has distinguished herself on stage in appearances at the Cleveland Playhouse. Washington, D.C.'s Arena Stage, San Diego Old Globe, Pasadena Playhouse, Actor's Theatre of Louisville, Cincinnati's Playhouse in the Park, Los Angeles Theater Center, Los Angeles' Mark Taper Forum, Williamstown Theater, and the Berkshire Summer Festival. Metroplex residents will recall her stellar performances at Dallas' Theatre Three. She is the recipient of three Los Angeles Dramalogue Awards for excellence in acting.

Her playwriting credits include her one woman show *The Knife Thrower's Assistant*, for which she won the Best of Fringe Award at the Edinburgh Fringe (Scotland) and which also played at Theatre Three. She is co-author of the musical Cowboy based on the life of Western painter. Charles Russell; Idols of the King, based on the life of Elvis Presley, and The Last of the Honky Tonk Angels, and is author of a cookbook, Sugar and Grease (paint). Most recently Ronnie Claire Edwards is a co-author of the play Wedding Belles, with Alan Bailey (author of Smoke On the Mountain). Wedding Belles was nominated for an American Theatre Critics Forum Award for 2008 as best new play produced outside New York City. She also authored and performed in the one woman show The True Story of the Incarceration of Little Egypt which premiered at Theatre Three. Her new play The Mystery of Miz Arnette recently premiered at the Bath House Cultural Center and is now available through Samuel French. Inc.


