John Patrick Shanley

PLAYWRIGHT

John Patrick Shanley is from The Bronx. His plays include Danny and the Deep Blue Sea, Savage in Limbo, The Dreamer Examines His Pillow, Italian American Reconciliation, Four Dogs and a Bone, Beggars in the House of Plenty, Psychopathia Sexualis, Cellini, Where's My Money?, Dirty Story, Doubt, and Defiance. In the arena of screenwriting, he has eight movies to his credit, most recently Live From Baghdad for HBO, for which he received an Emmy nomination. Other films include Five Corners (Special Jury Prize, Barcelona Film Festival), Alive, and Joe Versus the Volcano, which he also directed. For his script of Moonstruck he received both the Writers Guild of America Award and an Academy Award for best original screenplay.

ARTISTIC STAFF

T.I. Walsh DIRECTOR » Mr. Walsh directs frequently for Theatre Three. His production of Mary Zimmerman's Metamorphoses at Theatre Three won a Dallas/Fort Worth Drama Critics Award for Best Direction. His Theatre Three production of Neil Simon's The Odd Couple was awarded a Best Ensemble Award from the Dallas/Fort Worth Drama Critics Association. T.J.'s first directing assignment for Theatre Three was Richard Dresser's delightful comedy Rounding Third. He performed his solo play Pleading Infinity at the New York International Fringe Festival in the summer of 2006 to critical praise. T.J. is the Artistic Director for the newly formed Trinity Shakespeare Festival at TCU in Fort Worth. He has an MFA in playwriting and a Ph.D. in theatre history and criticism from the University of Texas at Austin. His research interests are in the history and theory of authorship. He teaches theatre at Texas Christian University in Fort Worth.

Jac Alder SET DESIGN » Mr. Alder continues designing for

both Theatre Three and Theatre Too. Set designing for last season includes Mack & Mabel. The Goodbye Girl, and the revival of All About Bette: An Evening with Bette Davis. He co-designed with David Walsh on productions of Pygmalion and Season's Greetings. Jac's long service in design to Theatre Three follows his education as an architect, a profession he practiced in Dallas following his discharge from his military service of '58 and '59. He is the designer of the unique performing space of Theatre Three and consults frequently with theatre groups adapting or building new spaces for drama. An original founder of Theatre Three (with his late wife, Norma Young), Alder continues in his role as Executive Producer-Director of Theatre Three. He has designed many shows for WaterTower Theatre, Uptown Players, Cross-Roads Theatre, Garland Civic Theatre, Garland Summer Musicals, Lyric Stage, Irving; Contemporary Theatre of Dallas, Kauffman Civic Theatre, and Coppell Community Theatre. Michael has also designed for many of our local colleges and universities: University of North Texas Opera Theatre, Texas Christian University Opera Studio, University of Texas at Dallas, Brookhaven College, and Richland College. His awards include "Best Costume Shop" (Dallas Observer 2000), "Best Costumes" for Old Settler (Dallas/Fort Worth Critics Forum Awards 2003), and the Rabin Award for Best Costume in a Play or Musical (2001, 2002, and 2005).

Tristan Decker LIGHTING DESIGN » This is Mr. Decker's sixth mainstage production with Theatre Three. His previous shows being Vieux Carre, Talking Pictures, Metamorphoses, Imaginary Invalid, and Putting It Together. Defiance is his third production with T.J. Walsh. Tristan has designed at numerous theaters around town, including The Dallas Theater Center, Shakespeare Dallas, Kitchen Dog, Our Endeavors Theater Collective, Texas Christian University, and more. He also works nationally with River City Repertory of Shreveport, LA where he just lit Carson McCullers' Member of the Wedding, starring **Oscar Nominee Margaret** Avery. And he is the resident Set and Lighting Designer at the University of Dallas. Tristan is also working on his MA in Drama at Texas Woman's University where he has returned to the "boards" playing Hal in David Auburn's Proof, and will soon be playing Tom in The Glass Menagerie. He was recently awarded the Texas Educational Theater Association's Debut Scholar Award for his paper "The Myth-Application of Vitruvius' Echea", and has received numerous DFW Theater Critics Forum awards and Leon Rabin Award nominations. **Richard Frohlich sound DESIGN** » Mr. Frohlich's previous assignments for Theatre Three include House and Garden. Whodunnit, Crimes of the Heart, Pygmalion, Popcorn, All About Bette: An Evening with Bette Davis, Democracy, Talking Pictures, Vieux Carre, and The Full Monty. He has designed sound for shows at Uptown Players, Irving **Community Theater** Mainstage, Echo Theater, Contemporary Theatre of Dallas, and Texas Radio Theatre Company. Mr. Frohlich is also a producer and director for vocational and educational videos. His awards include a 2002 Ogle (Horror/ Fantasy Audio Production), 2004 Mark Time (Science Fiction Audio Production) and a 2006 Column Award for his sound

design of The Full Monty. **Richard lives in Arlington** with his wife Shannan and his children Dillon, Emily and James. Kerry Cole AEA STAGE MANAGER » Ms. Cole's prior stage managing experiences include Theatre Three's productions of A Dog's Life, Democracy, and The Odd Couple; and Shakespeare Festival of Dallas, Plano Repertory Theatre and Wayside Theater in Virginia, where she served as Resident Equity Stage Manager. In addition to stage management, Kerry's production history includes acting, directing, producing and writing credits. She directed Theatre Three's productions of Talking Pictures and Whodunnit and Theatre Too's production of Season's Greetings. Most recently, she played Trish in Theatre Three's House and Garden. She currently teaches theatre at both the University of North Texas and Richland College.

PLAYWRIGHT

Bruce R. Coleman (writer/film junkie) is very pleased to be premiering his new play, Look What's Happened To Pixie De Costa, here in Theatre Too, virtually ten feet from his office/washroom/ septic tank. Past writing efforts include A History Lesson for New Theatre Company, starring Phyllis Cicero and Denise Lee, Given Away starring Ted's big crush, Norbert Osborn, and Night And Day, The Music of Cole Porter, which was nominated for four Leon Rabin awards, including Best Musical of the Year. For MacArthur High School in Irving, Texas, Bruce collaborated with several of his students and created Never, Never Jam Today: A Country, Hip Hop, Emo, Deathmetal, Rock-A-Billy Riff On Alice's Adventures In Wonderland. Bruce also wrote the tele-script for Cheaters, which was broadcast on Irving Community Television Network several times in 2006 -2007. Mr. Coleman's next writing project will be The Ballad of Belva Jane, biographical musical based on the life of his grandmother, the meanest woman he ever knew.

FROM THE DIRECTOR, BRUCE R. COLEMAN, THE GUY WHO THINK HE'S IN CHARGE: For me, this playwriting experience has been all about the influences;

1.) Charles Ludlam (1943 – 1987) – The mad genius/actor/ writer/director behind The Ridiculous Theatre in New York. In his lifetime he created 30 some odd plays (yes, some of them VERY odd) that were rich in character and story. Known for their allusions to great literature, baroque sexuality, joyful bawdiness, drag queen aesthetic and sheer gustiness, Mr. Ludlams plays with their loopy language, endless imagination and elaborate worlds carved out of cardboard and glitter, have been the driving influence of my career. He is my hero.

2.) Film Noir – A film genre that specialized in exposing the darkest, nastiest corners of man's psyche. It dragged the icky out of humanity's soul and paraded it across the screen for the entire world to see. Favorite noir image? Bill Holden floating in that swimming pool at the top of *Sunset Boulevard*. Favorite noir film? *Kiss Me Deadly.* It starts with a near naked Cloris Leachman being tortured to death by some creep with a pair of pliers and ends with an atomic blast. Nothing better.

3.) Whatever Happened to Baby Jane? -A cheap, shoddy, horror novel by Henry Farrell that became a cheap, shoddy, CLASSIC, horror movie directed by Robert Aldrich. The story follows the deep and destructive bond that ties two has-been show-biz sisters to each other, which, of course, leads to no good. Bette Davis and Joan Crawford essayed these roles in the film to startling effect. My English teacher showed our class this movie when I was in seventh grade. Any questions you may have had about me have now been officially answered.
