





PLAYWRIGHT

Lucy Prebble lives in London . Her most recent play. The Effect, opened at the National Theatre in London in November of 2012. Her smash-hit play, Enron, transferred to the West End and Broadway in 2010 after sell out runs at both the Royal Court and Chichester Festival Theatre. In addition to the huge critical acclaim it has received, Enron also won the award for best New Play at the prestigious TMA Theatre Awards, and was shortlisted for the Evening Standard Award 2009. Lucy created the TV series Secret Diary of a Call Girl, starring Billie Piper, which enjoyed three series and was sold to Showtime, the major US channel famed for its daring dramas. Lucy won the prestigious George Devine Award 200 for her outstanding debut play The yndrome in May 2004, followed by the ... A Award for Best New Play in October 2004. She also won the 2004 Critics' Circle Award for Most Promising Playwright, Lucy was also nominated for the Most Promising Newcomer Award at the Olivier Awards 2004, shortlisted for the Susan Smith Blackburn Award 2003 and nominated for the prestigious Evening Standard Charles Wintour Most Promising Playwright Award 2003.

Jeffrey Schmidt DIRECTOR/SET DESIGN » Mr. Schmidt's T3 directing/design credits include: Bengal Tiger at the Baghdad Zoo, The Farnsworth Invention, Language of Angels, Sherlock Holmes in The Crucifer of Blood, and Talley's Folly. As co-founder of The Drama Club, he co-designed/wrote The Muse, directed/designed/wrote The Old Woman in the Wood, and directed/co-designed/adapted Strindberg's The Ghost Sonata. Other design credits: several productions for T₃, Diamond Project X, End Days and Well for Echo The: ____ and the horse heads for Uptown Players' Equus. He was artistic director of MoonWater Theater Company for three years. Jeffrey last appeared onstage at NYC's La Mama Theatre in Diamond Dick, as Benedict

in Shakespeare Dallas' reading of Much Ado

About Nothing, and in Charm as Emerson at Kitchen Dog Theater. TV credits include: Dallas, The Good Guys, My Generation, Crash, The Deep End, Prison Break, Friday Night Lights, Your House and Home, and Whattaya Think. Look for him as Dr. Day in the recent release of feature film Bad Kids Go to Hell, and this fall in the feature film Parkland as Richard Stolley. Next, he set designs the summer productions for Shakespeare Dallas and then will marry the love of his life, Lydia Mackay! He is represented by the Mary Collins Agency.

Terry Dobson Musical Director » Mr. Dobson has been a multi-talented member of Theatre Three's Artistic Staff since May 1980. He currently serves as T₃'s Musical Director and Company Manager. His recent directing credits are Idols of the King, Freud's Last Session, Art of Murder, Flaming Guns of the Purple Sage, Songs from an Unmade Bed, I Love You, You're Perfect, Now Change (Theatre Three's most popular show), The Roads to Home, Another Night Before Christmas and Six Dance Lessons in Six Weeks.
