



About the Playwright

Tennessee Williams' personal life and experiences have always been the direct subject matter for his dramas. Williams was born Thomas Lanier Williams in Columbus, Mississippi. He lived the first ten years of his life in his grandparents' expansive Episcopal home. His mother was rather quiet and possessive, demonstrating a tremendous attachment to her children, becoming the inspiration for Amanda Wingfield. Williams himself was a rather delicate child. plagued with several childhood diseases which kept him from attending regular school. When Williams was about twelve, his father accepted a position in a shoe factory in St. Louis and moved the family to a tenement building. Their cramped apartment and the ugliness of the city life seemed to make a lasting impression. It was here in St. Louis that Williams' older sister, Rose, ceased to develop as a person and failed to cross the barrier from childhood to adulthood. She, like Laura in The Glass Menagerie, began to live in her own world of glass ornaments. Eventually, she had to be placed in an institution. Laura's desire to lose herself from the world was a characteristic of his own sister. Both were seen by Williams as being shy, quiet, lovely girls who were not able to cope with the modern world. After his third

at the shoe factory. He spent dreary days at the warehouse and then devoted his nights to writing poetry, plays, and short stories. After two years, he had a nervous breakdown and went to Memphis, Tennessee to visit his grandfather. His years of frustration and his dislike of the warehouse job are reflected directly in the character of Tom Wingfield, who followed essentially the same pattern that Williams himself followed. In fact, Tennessee would later gave this character his own first name. He later attended Washington University in St. Louis, where he had some of his earlier works produced. He drifted around the country, writing and taking odd jobs until his first great success with The Glass Menagerie in 1944.

Bruce R. Coleman DIRECTOR, SET DESIGN, & COSTUME DESIGN Bruce has been associated with Theatre Three for 30 years. He directed his first show on the Norma Young Arena Stage at the ripe old age of 24 and he has directed and designed over one hundred plays and musicals for the theatre ever since. Some favorite past assignments include The Liar; The Hot Mikado; By The Way, Meet Vera Stark; Assassins; City of Angels; Present Laughter; Superior Donuts; Bloody Bloody Andrew Jackson; Tales From Mount Olympus; Pippin; and Look What's Happened to Pixie De Costa. Bruce has also

directed for other local theatres including The Nance and Equus for Uptown players, Our Town and The Secret Garden for ICT MainStage, and The Apartment Plays for Upstart Theatre. For the last nine summers, Bruce has also designed costumes for The Junior Players' summer Shakespeare production out at Samuell Grand Park. He has been recognized by the Dallas Critics Forum awards. The Leon Rabin Awards. The Dallas Observer Best Of... Issue. and The Column Awards for his contributions to local theatre. Bruce's costumes for Trysts in Toledo (written by Jac Alder) received a Dallas Critics Forum Award for outstanding design. Love you to the moon, Jac!

She has worked with many organizations in the Dallas/Fort Worth area, including Texas Ballet Theatre and Kitchen Dog Theater, where she is a company member.
