

### From the Creators

In seeking to create a theatrical musical from adapted folk songs, The Kountry Girls was born. Our initial goal was to hang a sweet story around 18th and 19th century American, English, Irish and Scottish ballads. We found a wealth of music that enabled us to embrace the timeless themes of economic hardship, enduring love, redemption, and family struggles. The seeds of rural folk music preceded recordings and radio, and so were passed down orally through families. The economically challenged embraced traditional music and enjoyed it in this, its most basic form. Frequently, tunes were modified and fitted with new lyrics. The English Christmas Carol "What Child is This?" was created from "Greensleeves". This ageless practice of spontaneous music creation served as the perfect backdrop to our story. Our research helped us discover that traditional music is still widely enjoyed on both sides of the Atlantic, even when lyrics are a bit archaic and not easily understood. Timeless tunes have allowed American folk music to evolve through the ages. Bluegrass, the sub-genre of country music, has its roots in English and Scottish ballads with later African-American influences which Americanized traditional songs. Stephen Foster, the father of American music, was influenced by folk, parlor and minstrel forms. He wrote the state songs of Kentucky and Florida, which were posthumously modified to be less racially offensive. When Pete Seeger, with three other contributors, altered lyrics of

the African-American spiritual from "We will overcome" to We shall overcome", the song became the anthem of the American civil rights movement. These are just a few examples of organic changes that have been part of the continuing folk music revival and are represented in The Kountry Girls. We approached The Kountry Girls as a blank canvas of a "roots" musical opportunity. With the exception of one original song, based on a Mark Twain anecdote, all of The Kountry Girls music is derived from traditional songs from America or the British Isles. We hope the result will provide you, our audience. an entertaining musical experience. Thank you for attending the World Premiere of The Kountry Girls.

### BRIEFLY...ARTISTIC STAFF & CAST BIOGRAPHIES

Ken Murchison WRITER Ken is an entrepreneur and a creative producer. He created and co-wrote Crock: the Untold Story of Davy Crockett which ran for three weeks in October of 1995 at The Albert and Margaret Hill Theatre at the Hall of State in Fair Park. Some of the music from Crock was scored and performed by the Dixie Chicks. In 2011, Mr. Murchison produced two workshops of Debutante Warriors based on a graphic novel he created. The initial production was presented at the WaterTower Theatre's Out of the Loop Fringe Festival. The other workshop had a brief run at the Charles Eisemann Theatre in Richardson. He has collaborated for two years with Sonny Franks and Andy Clendennen on The Kountry

Girls and is delighted to have its World Premiere at Theatre Three.

Andrew Clendenen WRITER Andrew was the front man for the 1960's rock band The Heard as well as one half of The Clendenen Twins guitar duo. In addition to handling lead vocals for both groups, Andrew played guitar and harmonica. Both bands' music was released on the double LP "The Heard and the Music of the Clendenen Twins", which features songs co-written by Andrew. Andrew recently wrapped the recording of a soon to be released solo album entitled "Vein of Blue". The album, which is currently in post-production, features original music penned by Andrew. He handles all guitar, piano, and vocals and is backed on drums by producer Jonathan Jackson. When he isn't writing and recording music, Andrew enjoys writing fiction. He recently wrote a screenplay entitled The Dream. The science fiction love story tells the tale of a champion bull rider from Canada and an astrophysicist from China. Andrew holds an MBA from The University of Texas, Dallas.

Kerry Cole DIRECTOR The Kountry Girls marks Ms. Cole's 7th directing assignment at Theatre Three. She also wrote and directed four productions for our youngaudiences outreach program and has acted in or stage managed over 30 shows with us. 


