### ABOUT THE PLAYERS:

DAVID NICHOLS (Hector) - "Thieves' Carnival" marks the return of David Nichols, an audience and critical favorite of the '61-'62 season when he appeared in "Liliom", "Waiting for Godot", "Mrs. McThing", "Member of the Wedding" and "Born Yesterday". During his sabbatical from the Theatre Three stage he has worked in the Hollywood film industry. Now back in Dallas he is contributing to Dallas' growing movie making activity.

SHARON SPENCE (Eva) - Sharon Spence comes to Dallas from a position as staff actress at the famous Pittsburgh Playhouse. In addition to acting, Miss Spence is frequently seen as a model for local and national publications. In private life Miss Spence is the wife of Yves L'Helgoual'ch, Dallas Symphony Orchestra cellist who served this production as composer. She was seen last season in "Dark of the Moon" on the arena stage.

CHARLES ROBERTS (Peterbono) - A veteran of Theatre Three from its first season, Mr. Roberts has played leading roles in many of the theatre's biggest hits. Last season he was seen in "Dark of the Moon" and "Visit to a Small Planet" Prior to that he originated the role of Dracula in Theatre Three's original musical comedy, "Count Dracula, Or; A Musical Mania from Transylvania". He is a graduate of North Texas State University's drama department and is a native of Dallas.

JACK NANCE (Gustav) - "Thieves' Carnival" marks the Theatre Three debut of this young actor. Mr. Nance attended North Texas State University. He toured two years with the National Children's Theatre as a leading actor. Last season he appeared in the Dallas Theater Center's "The Tempest".

GAIL ELLIOTT (Juliette) - This lovely ingenue is a newcomer of one year to Dallas from North Carolina making her Theatre Three and her theatrical debut in "Thieves' Carnival". She is completing her studies at Thomas Jefferson.

MADELEINE WADE (Lady Hurf) - An early professional career on the stage and in radio took a back seat to family pursuits until last season when Mrs. Wade played the role of Lillie in "Cat's Eye", the original drama by Carolyn Echols that Theatre Three premiered. Her husband, Jim Wade, is active in state politics.

RON BROCK (Lord Edgard) - A prize-winning drama coach for the Richardson school system, Mr. Brock makes his Theatre Three debut as Lord Edgard. His wife, Melinda, appeared last season in "Dark of the Moon". They are both graduates of North Texas State University.

JAC ALDER (Dupont Dufort, Sr.) - One of Theatre Three's original founders, Mr. Alder has served the theatre as designer, director, actor and administrator since 1961. He will direct Theatre Three's forthcoming production of the musical comedy hit, "A Funny Thing Happened on the Way to the Forum" opening mid-November.

KIMBERLY WEBB (Dupont Dufort, Jr.) - Heavily experienced for so young an actor, Mr. Webb has been a leading actor for Tony Vinctcent's Harlequin Players for two seasons. He was seen last year on Theatre Three's stage in "Alice in Wonderland" and "Write Me a Murder".
