Artistic Staff Biographies

Alan Menken

(COMPOSER)Legendary composer Alan Menken has created some of the most beloved songs and musical scores of our time, with his unique voice as a composer capturing the imagination of audiences for over 35 years. Known for his music on stage and screen, he is noted for his multiple works with the Walt Disney company (The Little Mermaid, Beauty and the Beast, Aladdin), as well as Broadway stage musicals Sister Act and Little Shop of Horrors. With eight Academy Awards, Alan has received more Oscars than any living person, and is the recipient of numerous other awards including Golden Globes, Grammys, Drama Desk Awards, and a Tony Award.

Howard Ashman

(PLAYWRIGHT) Howard Ashman was an American playwright and movie music lyricist. He collaborated with Alan Menken on several films. notably animated features for Disney, Ashman writing the lyrics and Menken composing the scores. Menken and Ashman also collaborated on Little Shop of Horrors with Ashman as director, lyricist, and librettist. Along with Menken, Ashman was the co-recipient of two Grammy Awards, two Golden Globes and two Oscars. His second Academy Award in 1992 was awarded posthumuously for Best Song and was accepted by his partner, Bill Lauch. It was the first Academy Award given posthumously to someone who had died of AIDS. Ashman died on March 14, 1991, at age 40, during

the making of both *Beauty* and the Beast and Aladdin. Ashman and Menken had finished the songs for *Beauty* and the Beast, but Tim Rice was brought in to finish Aladdin songs with Menken.

Joel Ferrell

(DIRECTOR) is a Dallasbased Theater maker who has worked across the nation as a director, choreographer, actor, and producer. He's thrilled to be back with T3 after last summer's production of Meredith Wilson's, The Music Man. loel served as Associate Artistic Director with Dallas Theater Center for a decade and really loves the DFW theater community. Cody Dry

(MUSIC DIRECTOR) has recently returned to his native Dallas from working in NYC as a music director, accompanist, and vocal coach. He has worked with the Broadway production of Book of Mormon as rehearsal accompanist and keyboard sub. He music directed Tony Award-winning actress Alice Ripley (Next to Normal, Side Show, Tommy, Rocky Horror Show) in a production of *Baby*, along with Christina Sajous (Sandy Cheeks in Nickelodeon's live taping of Spongebob the Musical). Cody also taught alongside Jenn Gambatese (Mrs. Doubtfire, All Shook Up, Tarzan, Wicked, Hairspray), Lamar Baylor and Syndee Winters of The Lion King for the organization The

Broadway Star Project, a group that keeps young adult actors performing. With that organization he has music directed their 2019 holiday album, arranged and directed their performance with the Rockettes at Radio City Music Hall, and has traveled to Mexico and Guatemala to teach young performers there. At the Hartt School (University of Hartford), he served as vocal coach, accompanist, and music director. He has also music directed and accompanied cabarets at renowned NYC venues such as Feinstein's 54 Below and Green Room 42. Cody currently teaches private voice and serves as collaborative pianist at The Greenhill School. He holds a music degree from the University of North Texas.

Ani Vera-Hernandez

(CHOREOGRAPHER) started her theatrical career in 2009 with Project X and Kitchen Dog. Her dance performance/ choreography landed her a debut role in Rocky Horror Show with Dallas Theater Center. She is also a traveling choreographer for USAGymnastics programs around the states and was recently a featured choreographer for Junior Players summer production, Amplify. She is honored to contribute and work with Theater Three for the first time

Ashley Newman

(STAGE MANAGER) is a Dallas-based AEA Stage Manager. Credits in DFW include shows at Lyric Stage and Dallas Children's
