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

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Talking with Playwright, Nicole Neely and Composer, Clint Gilbert

What inspired you to write Stede Bonnet: A F*cking Pirate Musical?

NN: In an episode of *This American Life* titled "I Am Not a Pirate," their first subject is the Gentleman Pirate, Stede Bonnet. His story made me laugh, I had never heard of him before. I was drawn to his desire to "rewrite his story" and even more drawn to the fact

that he was really, REALLY bad at what he wanted to do.

CG: Then Blackbeard!

NN: His intimidation tactics were so theatrical, it was so much fun to research. Then I approached Clint two months and some change before our wedding and said, "Hey, I scheduled a Monday Night Playwright at Theatre Three and I want to write about Stede Bonnet and Blackbeard. Can you get me 12 songs in two-ish months? And he said...

CG: "I've been waiting my whole life for this moment."

How would you describe the style of the music?

CG: Adult Swim Disney.
NN: Yeah, that sounds right.

What do you hope the audience will take away from this musical?

NN: On the surface, I hope the expectation for a musical that makes you laugh is met. I want joy for you. I want to rattle the dust that has settled on all of us. On a slightly deeper level, I want you to walk into the theatre knowing that Stede Bonnet is not a hero. The journey I've imagined for him is based in research, but much of this musical is imagined.

What drew me to his story as a person approaching 30 years old was his boldness and naivety at the same age. Not brave, not inherently good, and not admirable. Just bold. He changed the course of his life on a whim.

What a story!

CG: We wanted this show to feel like a Disney cartoon featurette for adults. No one in this story is truly "good," and Stede walks a path of spectacular failure and unbeatable depression. Even though he's the worst, we find ourselves empathizing with him



because we're afraid of making mistakes as big and dumb as his. The songs are hymns to the hopes of being able to rewrite one's life, the regrets of hurting those we love, the longing for more sun-filled days, and the knowledge that we're all gonna die. We hope the show is fun and cathartic for everyone seeing it, and we hope everyone feels the joy we felt from making it.





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
