





He was seen in The Dallas Summer Musical production of South Pacific, in WaterTower Theatre's Little Shop of Horrors, in Houston's T.U.T.S. production of Scrooge and Dallas Children's Theatre production of *Island of the Blue Dolphin*. Past T3 productions include The Threepenny Opera, Into the Woods, Dreams from a Summer House, Assassins, Amphitryon and four productions of The Fantasticks. Linda K. Leonard (Woman #2) was seen in Guys and Dolls at the Dallas Theater Center, and at WaterTower Theatre as Education Director before making her T3 debut in the initial upstairs run of this show. 


Biographies (continued):
