

## About Myths and Hymns

"Many of these songs are adapted from Greek myths and from lyrics I found in an old hymnal in a used bookshop. I used these dissimilar cosmologies as points of departure and discovered as I went along that they have a lot in common — a desire to transcend earthly bounds, to bond with something or someone greater. They seem to complement each other, reflecting different parts of us: the myths, our behaviors; the hymns, our prayers."

#### Background on the Myths of Myths and Hymns:

Saturn Returns: In Greek mythology, Saturn was called Cronus, the God of Agriculture. After deposing his father, Saturn became the ruler of the Universe. It was prophesized that his children would depose him. To prevent this, he would devour his own children. According to Roman mythology, his sixth child, Zeus did overthrow him and forced Saturn to throw up his siblings. Saturn escaped to Rome, where he established the Golden Age, a time of prosperity and peace. Saturn represents fatherhood and its challenges, as well as the annual rituals of sowing and harvesting and the importance of its timing. He is often referred to as "Father Time". The planet Saturn takes 29.5 years to revolve around the Earth. The time that it takes to travel is considered a time of reflection of one's life. Saturn's story teaches about confrontation, perseverance, self acceptance, and the wisdom that comes with age.

Icarus: Icarus and his father Daedalus were imprisoned in a labyrinth on the isle of Crete. Daedalus devised wings of feather and wax for their escape but warned Icarus not to fly too close to the sun. Icarus did not heed his advice.

Pegasus: The gods gave Bellerophon a winged horse. Pegasus, to assist him in his heroic deeds. But Bellerophon's hubris angered the gods, and they sent a gadfly to bite Pegasus so that she would throw Bellerophon to the ground.

Hero and Leander. Hero, the high priestess of Aphrodite, lived across the Hellespont from her lover, Leander. Every night he would swim to her, guided by torch that she would set for him at the top of the tower. One stormy night, the torch was blown out, and Leander was drowned. Heartbroken, Hero threw herself in after him.

Sisyphus: As punishment for betraying Zeus' confidence, Sisyphus was sentenced to roll a boulder up a mountainside over and over, forever,






