


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

ABOUT THE PLAYERS

CAMILLA CARR (Reno) first appeared on Theatre Three's stage as Evie in "Stop the World — I Want to Get Off" opposite Larry O'Dwyer. The wife of actor Hugh Feagin, she is resuming her career after a "temporary retirement." His name is Caley O'Dwyer Feagin and he's six months old.

LARRY O'DWYER (Moon) last appeared for Theatre Three as Psuedolus in "A Funny Thing Happened on the Way to the Forum", but his career embraces such diverse parts as the title role in "Tartuffe", Cocky in "Roar of the Greasepaint", Mr. Zero in "The Adding Machine" and Daddy in "The American Dream."

LARRY WHITCHER (Billy) made his debut on Theatre Three's stage in the 1966 production of "A Funny Thing Happened on the Way to the Forum." Subsequently, he has played in "The Boy Friend", "The Fantasticks", and "Celebration" as well as the 1970 revival of "Forum."


