notes from the director:

I have been uncommonly lucky. "Bus Stop" is my sixth directorial assignment for Theatre Three and once yet again I've enjoyed the benefit of a highly creative, competent and conscientious cast and crew. The play you are seeing tonight has been a favorite of mine and one I have wanted to direct since it first appeared in New York. Such a long-time anticipation could pave the way to disappointment if it were not for the co-operation of the actors. My thanks to each of them and my congratulations.

"Bus Stop" is the first play by Willlam Inge Theatre Three has produced. The distinguished author, winner of the Pulitzer Prize and the Drama Critics' Circle Award, also wrote "Picnic", "Come Back Little Sheba", "Dark at the Top of the Stairs", "Natural Affection" and this season's "Where's Daddy?" Dallas can be proud of the fact that it was in our city that Mr. Inge saw the first professional production of one of his plays when the late Margo Jones opened her theatre with "Farther Off From Heaven", (which later became "Dark at the Top of the Stairs"). However, Theatre Three had a previous association with Mr. Inge when he agreed to assist in the judging of original one-act plays in a 1963 contest co-sponsored by Theatre Three and the Dallas Times Herald. Though "Bus Stop" is the only Inge play so far on our arena stage, we look forward to future productions authored by the now-famous Dallas "discovery".

"Bus Stop" is a wise play. The characters are deeply human, the dialogue is fresh, witty and honest and the dramatic situations are direct and universal. There is a certain artlessness to Mr. Inge's play that conceals, (and quite rightly), a superb grasp of the playwright's craft. We're very proud to have it on our stage, and very pleased you came to share it with us.
