NOTES FROM THE DIRECTOR, LARRY O'DWYER

Tonight's experience is a combination of Geoffrey Chaucer and a sort of rock concept. Our premise has been story theatre: the telling of tales in a simple and human way.

We tell our tales through youth without the elaborate (but often) boring trappings of Broadway.

This is the Theatre of the poor. But t has riches. A Theatre of by-for people — people who want to know what is happening now; Theatre of the wealth of sex; Theatre of the beouty of Christ's life.

It was created not only by myself and my dear friend, Gary Brockett, but by the people I respect most in the world — actors. I bring them together in this holy place, the Theatre.
