#### ABOUT STEPHEN SONDHEIM ...

Born March 22, 1930, Stephen Sondheim received his early musical inspiration from another songwriting great, Oscar Hammerstein. Sondheim's father, a successful New York dress manufacturer, and his mother divorced when Sondheim was ten and he moved with his mother to a farm in Pennsylvania. Among his mother's acquaintances in Pennsylvania was the Oscar Hammerstein family. Young Sondheim became intrigued with musical theatre while watching Hammerstein work on a new Broadway musical, "Oklahoma." Sondheim studied music at Williams College and upon graduation, won the Hutchinson Prize, a two-year fellowship which he utilized to study with avant-garde composer Milton Babbitt in New York. By the age of twenty-seven, he had collaborated with Leonard Bernstein on his first Broadway production, "West Side Story." Over the past two decades, Sondheim has received numerous Tony Awards and earned a reputation for producing musicals to entertain "the thinking man." His innovative approach is credited with sparking new life into contemporary musical theatre.



## WHO'S WHO IN THE CAST

LISA K. HOWARD — Miss Howard performed at Theatre Three earlier this season as Major Stone in the Bertolt Breeht/ Kurt Weill musical "Happy End." 

Previous roles include Laurey in the Country Dinner Playhouse production of "Oklahoma" and Rosemary in "How to Succeed in Business Without Really Trying", also at Country Dinner Playhouse. She has appeared in "My Fair Lady", "Gigi", "Show Boat", and "Brigadoon" at Casa Manana and in numerous Ft. Worth Opera productions including "Lucia di Lammermoor", "The Marriage of Figaro", "Cavalleria Rusticana", and "i Pagliacci."

\*CONNIE NELSON — "Side by Side by Sondheim" is Miss Nelson's second appearance at Theatre Three. Audiences will remember her as Sister Rita in "The Runner Stumbles" earlier this season. Miss Nelson just returned from New York where she appeared off-Broadway as Wanda in "Kennedy's Children." While pursuing her B.F.A. in acting at S.M.U., she worked as a "Haymaker" at the Country Dinner Playhouse. Last summer Miss Nelson appeared in the Dallas Summer Musical's "South Pacific" and toured with Herschel Bernardi in "Fiddler On The Roof."

JAC ALDER (Director) — Producer-Director Jac Alder is responsible for introducing the musical revue into Theatre Three's repertoire. This is the theatre's fourth season to close with a musical tribute. During the current season, Mr. Alder has directed Theatre Three's productions of "The Shadow Box" and "The Runner Stumbles", and both directed and performed in the musical "Starting Here, Starting Now." Mr. Alder graduated from the University of Oklahoma where he studied architecture, a profession he practiced for seven years before joining Theatre Three. Besides his involvement with this theatre, he is also Director of Theatre at the University of Texas at Arlington.


