

Beyond Porpoises



Durang

Occupying that netherworld between comedy and tragedy, the plays of Christopher Durang often fascinate at the same time that they repel. Mix equal parts venom and satire with a dash of helplessness, and you have an idea of the flavor of the works authored by Broadway's self-proclaimed "oldest living promising young playwright." (which may explain why at this point in his 27-year old career Durang remains an acquired taste for some, while others enjoy his works with cult-like adoration).

Unlike many playwrights, Durang found not only his subject while still in his early twenties but his voice as well. One of his instructors at the Yale School of Drama described Durang's work as "...a scream for help in a world he knows will provide none -- so he keeps right on screaming until he gets laughs for the sheer absurdity of it." "When it's done right, the work can be both riotously funny and darkly disturbing," adds Durang -- the slightly cracked hybrid of Aristophanes, Swift, and Ionesco.

Simultaneously funny and disturbing seems to accurately describe the majority of Durang's playwriting scenarios. In *Sister Mary Ignatius Explains it All for You*, an unstable nun lectures the audience until some of her former students arrive to reveal how she ruined their lives. In *Beyond Therapy* (which premiered in 1981 by the Phoenix Theatre in NYC), a psychiatrist refers repeatedly to patients as porpoises. And then there's *The Marriage of Bette and Boo*, in which Bette loses her baby; the doctor brings it in and promptly drops it on the floor.

This Theatre Three production of Beyond Therapy is not the first time T3 audiences have enjoyed the tumultuous comedy of Christopher Durang. Past summer flings with this master satirist have featured Sister Mary..., For Whom the Southern Belle Tolls, and The Actor's Nightmare --each of these works now considered classic Durang fare. Currently playing on off-Broadway is Durang's newest venture, Betty's Summer Vacation, running at Playwrights' Horizon. This critically acclaimed comic romp deals with a woman who manages -- and mismanages -- the eccentric guests who come to her East Coast summer retreat (for more info on the Playwright's Horizon production of Betty..., go to www.ny.com/entertainment/theatre/off-broadway/betty's.html).

Durang's blend of strange comedy and drama continues to frequently earn him both audience outrage - and critical praise. "Audiences just need to keep in mind that only a writer of real talent can write an angry play that remains funny and controlled even in its most savage moments," states NY Times theatre reviewer Ben Brantley. John Simon of New York magazine adds, "[Durang is] a singularly courageous satirist, whose pen is dipped...in the blood of his own personal wounds."

Therein, the masterful wit and riotousness of Durang combines to evoke laughter, reflection, even tears. More often than not, empathy for his troubled protagonists can also be added to this list. The characters are, of course, struggling through what we cumulatively know as the human experience...an experience that is at once maddening as well as exquisitely satisfying.

As Durang knows all too well.
