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# Plauwright

**LEE BLESSING** has had over a dozen new plays produced in the last decade. The Signature Theater devoted its 1992-93 New York season to Blessing's works,including the world premiere of his play, *Patient A*. In 1988, Blessing's play, *A Walk In The Woods*, opened on Broadway and was subsequently produced in Londo's West End, starring Sir Alex Guinness. It has since appeared on "American Playhouse" and stages worldwide.

Other plays include Fortinbras, Down The Road and Two Rooms, all commissioned by the La Jolla Playhouse; Cobb, which premiered at Yale Repertory Theater; Eleemosynary, produced by the Manhattan Theatre Club; Riches, Independence, Oldtimer's Game and Nice People Dancing To Good Country Music, all of which premiered at the Actors Theatre of Louisville; and, most recently, The Rights, a co-commission by the Theatre On The Square of Mairetta, GA and the Ensemble Theatre Company of Cincinnati, which also premiered his play, Lake Street Extension.

Mr. Blessing's plays have won the American Theater Critics Award and the George and Elisabeth Marton Award, and have been nominated for Tony and Olivier Awards and the Pulitzer Prize. He is the grateful recipient of grants from the NEA and the Guggenheim, Bush, McKnight and Jerome Foundations.

Mr. Blessing's TNT film, *Cooperstown*, starring Alan Arkin and Graham Greene, won the 1993 Humanities Prize for PBS/Cable as well as three nominations for 1993 Cable Ace Awards, including best writing. He is currently working on screenplays for both the Savoy and Disney companies.

Fortinbras received its world premiere at the La Jolla Playhouse in La Jolla, California, on June 18, 1991.

JONATHAN BRENT (Hamlet, Prince of Denmark) was last seen in Undermain's production of Mad Forest in which he played Gabriel. Mr. Brent is a bit of a "neurotic nomad," as he coins the term. Although born in Dallas, he has moved around quite a lot. He was awarded a scholarship to train and study at Mountview Theatre School in London. While there, he underwent intensive training of many styles of acting - ranging from Jacobean to Restoration Comedy. He also trained with the Moscow Arts Theatre, focusing on Chekhov's plays. Some of his most memorable roles

have been Mozart in *Amadeus* and Billy in the London premiere of *Elegies for Angels, Punks and Raging Queens*. This may be Mr. Brent's debut with Theatre Three, but not for his family. His grandmother, mother and uncle have all walked through these halls. He is proud to be a part of the lineage.



TERRY DOBSON (Osric, member of the Danish court) has been associated with Theatre Three since May, 1980, as the Staff Musical Director and Assistant to the Producer. As Musical Director, he has been responsible for over forty musical productions, including last season's hit, Always...Patsy Cline. As an actor, Terry has appeared in several roles such as 93/94's Wholly Moliere! and The Fantasticks. In 1984, he was cited by the Dallas Times Herald as "Best Supporting Actor" for his role as Leon in The Wake of Jamey Foster. Terry is also the Musical Director for ENCORE! (the

small group ensemble from the renowned Turtle Creek Chorale) and a free-lance pianist and arranger. Last year he performed in concert with Carole Cook, Denise LeBrun and Dr. Timothy Seelig and several of his vocal arrangements are currently being performed by the Turtle Creek Chorale, The Lexington Men's Chorus and the Alamo City Men's Chorale. Terry dedicates this performance to Annie and Amanda (his cocker spaniel and her <u>Heinz 57</u> companion).



DENNIS MILLEGAN (Horatio, friend of Hamlet) makes his Theatre
Three debut with Fortiniras. He has been seen in such diverse roles as
Pepe in the Pocket Sandwich Theatre's Tear Jerker and as the Dog in Mad
Forest at the Undermain. Other Metroplex appearances include Alceste in
The Misanthrope and DeSoto in Royal Hunt of the Sun, both for Gryphon
Players, as well as Pantalone in Three Cuckolds at the Addison Centre
Theater. Dennis works with Kidsprov, an improvisational comedy troupe
which performs in schools throughout the state bringing fun and educa-

tion together for the benefit of children. He is also a founding member of Rubber Chicken, a comedy troupe which performs throughout the Dallas/Fort Worth area.



MARK HADLEY (Fortinbras, Prince of Norway) is making his third appearance at Theatre Three, having previously played Roy in A Small Family Business, and Lee Harvey Oswald in Assassins. Other area credits include Only Kidding and Emerald City (Circle Theatre), Prelude To A Kiss (Theatre Arlington), The Woods (new Artists' Theatre Co.), and Cymbeline (11th St. Theatre Project). Mark also recently directed Mamet, Dammit! for the New Artists' Theatre Co. Mark would like to thank his four cats for allowing him and his beautiful wife, Lanell, to live in their house.



FRANK CORTESE (Captain of the Norwegian Army) is making his first appearance at Theatre Three. A native of Stamford, Connecticut, he has studied with many coaches in the New York and Texas areas. He was last seen at the John Anthony Theater as the Scarlet Knight in Stefanie Hero. In addition to acting, Mr. Cortese also models throughout the United States. He has also made appearances in television and film, most recently on Walker, Texas Ranger. He is very excited to be performing at Theatre Three.

STEVE WESTERHEIDE (Marcellus, a sentinel) makes his first appearance with Theatre Three in Fortinbras. He has previously appeared as Larry in Pegasus Theatre's production of Men's Singles and as a 300 pound friar in the Pocket Sandwich Theatre's melodrama, The Legend Of Zorro. (That Slim-Fast really works!) Most recently he performed three separate roles (a corporate raider, a business executive and a vagrant) in the staged reading of Take II, It's Yours at Pegasus and originated the role of Brian in D. Marie Gillespie's comedy. Put Asunder for STAGES '93. Prior to moving

to Dallas, Mr. Westerheide appeared in numerous productions, counting as his favorite roles Matt in *The Fantasticks*, Venice in *Buried Child*, and Joey in *The Homecoming*. Originally from Muskogee, Oklahoma, he proudly proclaims Merle Haggard as the greatest country and Western singer who ever lived... while secretly acknowledging a terrible fear of the dreaded Muskogee mafia. Mr. Westerheide is also active in the broadcast industry.



LEM WHITE (Barnardo, a sentinel) was born in Washington, D.C. but has lived most of his life in Amarillo, Texas, where he earned his associate degree in Science at Amarillo College. He received a B.F.A. in Theatre with an emphasis on acting and directing from Texas Tech University in Lubbock. This is Mr. White's first appearance with Theatre Three. Some of his local favorite performances are Laughter for Undermain, The Night Hank Williams Died and A Few Good Men for the Circle Theatre and, most recently, K-2 for the new Woodburning Theatre Co.



DEBORAH SAMMONS (First Polish Maiden) has appeared in Theatre Three's production of DROOD! as an ensemble member. She graduated this May from the Performing Artists' Musical Theatre Conservatory at Mountain View College. Theatre roles include a principle soloist and dancer in Some Enclanted Evening, Glenda in The Wizard Of Oz and, most recently, Cassie in A Chorus Line. Prior to her theatre work, Ms. Sammons danced with the Fort Worth Ballet for one season.



ELLEN LOCY (Second Polish Maiden) is pleased to be making her Theatre Three debut in Fortinbras. She most recently played Satan in Rising Moon Theatre's A Season In Hell. Her favorite roles include the Sleeper in Almost Asleep at the Undermain Theatre, Shelby in Steel Magnolias at Casa Manaña, Charity in H.I.D.—Hess is Dead at the Addison Centre Theatre, Anna in Burn This at Hard City Theatre, and Angustias in The House Of Bernarda Alba at Theatro Dallas. Ms. Locy is also involved with the Playwright's Project and other organizations to help develop local writers'

works. She has performed in readings at the Pegasus Theatre and the Dallas Museum of Art and is also active in the film and broadcast industry.



TERRY VANDIVORT (Polonius, the Court Councillor and English Ambassa dor) was last seen on Theatre Three's stage in last season's production of Shadowlands as Christopher Riley, Wholly Molicre! (The School for Husbands and The Imaginary Cuckold) and A Small Family Business. Other Theatre Three productions include Waiting For Godol, Amateurs, Infidelities, London Assurance (Patron Favorite Award), A Funny Thing Happened On The Way To The Forum (Patron Favorite Award) and Taking Steps (Dallas Theatre Critics Forum Award). He has appeared in the Lean Theater production of

Patterns, directed by Thurman Moss. Mr. Vandivort recently completed performing in Boy Meets Girl at Addison Centre Theater. At Dallas Theater Center he has appeared in David Petrarca's production of a Midsummer Night's Dream and Misalliance. He played Trincula in The Tempest at Dallas Shakespeare Festival, and in School For Scandal and Kennedy's Children, both Off-Broadway productions. With Jerry Crow, Mr. Vandivort has co-written the musical revues

of *Cat on a Hot Tin Streetcar* and *The Binkleys of Broadway* for Born-In-A-Trunk Productions. Mr. Vandivort would like to dedicate this performance to Norma Young.



TABITHA WOODS (*Ophelia*, *Polonius' daughter*) makes her first appear ance with Theatre Three. She was most recently seen as Antonietta in *Tear Jerker* at the Pocket Sandwich Theatre, and as Florina in the Undermain Theatre's production of *Mad Forest*. Last summer she appeared in the Oklahoma Shakespearean Festival as Portia in *Julius Caesar*, and Maria in *Twelfth Night*. Currently Ms. Woods works as an actress/vocalist/director for the Big Time Radio Network and is a member of The Usual Suspects, an improvisation troupe based in Dallas.



**Dennis Maher** (*Claudius, King of Denmark*) last played Claudius in Theatre Three's production of *Rosencrantz and Guilderstern are Dead* eleven years ago. An actor/director/playwright for over twenty years, Mr. Maher has worked with UW-Madison and the Milwaukee Repertory Theatre in the development of new plays and with noted playwrights Preston Jones, Israel Horovitz, Larry Shue, Amlin Grey and Glen Allen Smith. He is also a frequently produced and award-winning playwright and director. A Professor and Director of Theatre Arts at UT/Arlington,

Mr. Maher's most recent performance was as Scrooge in Israel Horovitz's *Scrooge and Marley*. He will direct *Bleacher Bums* this July at UT/A. He lives in south Arlington with his wife, actor/director/playwright Melanie Mason, and is currently writing a musical about the early days of the film industry, a musical revue about the Depression and a "memory play."



Cecilia Flores (Gertrude, Queen of Denmark) first appeared at Theatre Three in 1975 in One Flew Over The Cuckoo's Nest with Hugh Feagin, as well as The Road To Rome, Ladies at the Alamo, Tartuffe, Fallen Angels, Candide and Arms and the Man, among others. She has performed on Broadway, Off Broadway, at the Dallas Theater Center (for both Paul Baker and Ken Bryant), Fort Worth's Shakespeare in the Park and the Dallas Children's Theater. Last season, Ms. Flores directed Shakin' The Mess Outta Misery for both Fort Worth's Jubilee Theater and Addison

Centre Theatre, Fuente Ovejuna at SMU's Greer Garson Theater, and will direct Iolanthe for the Texas Gilbert & Sullivan Company in November. A past chairwomen of the Texas Commission on the Arts' Theatre Panel and an Arts-in-Education and Expansion Arts panelist for the National Endowment for the Arts, she teaches Shakespeare and acting for KD Studios. This Gertrude is her first role from beyond the pale; she has played the live version.



MICHAEL DAVID (Laertes, Polonius's son) Performing for the first time at Theatre Three, actor Michael David has appeared in multiple plays, films and commercials in the Dallas area. A graduate from the University of North Texas, Mr. David paid his dues as an acting apprentice at the renowned Actor's Theatre of Louisville, KY., where he made his professional debut in the Humana Festival of New American Plays' production of In The Eye Of The Hurricane. Local credits include Captain Potts in Fu Manchu: The Melodrama at the Pocket Sandwich Theatre and Mercurio in

the U.N.T. production of Romeo and Juliet. Film projects include Born On The Fourth Of July and the up-coming Only In America.


# Artistic Staff

Jac Alder, Director, has, since co-founding Theatre Three in 1961, directed the majority of its musical presentations (last season he directed the holiday revival of The Fantasticks and the world premiere of Ball Games). Always interested in new works he has served for the last two years as the director/dramaturg for new musicals in the Northwood University studio program. Besides his interest in directing and developing musical works, Mr. Alder is particularly interested in classics having directed works by Shaw, Shakespeare, Moliere and Goldoni. As Executive Producer-Director he selects the season and assembles the artistic and administrative team that - working with the Theatre's Board - operates Theatre Three in its year-round service to Dallas and its visitors.

VERN McKinney, Technical Director, is in his third season at Theatre Three. A graduate of Angelo State University, Mr. McKinney has acted, directed or designed numerous shows. As an actor, he was last seen at Three Below in Mammet, Dammit! His most recent design work includes Vital Signs, H.M.H. Pinafore and Into The Woods. Mr. McKinney has directed The Woods, Sexual Perversity In Chicago, No Sex Please, We're British and Grandma Duck Is Dead. In 1992 Mr. McKinney and Mark Hadley began the New Artists Theatre Company. Their next production is John Brown's Body.

DEIDRE MOSER, Costumes, is starting her third season at Theatre Three. Ms. Moser's costume designs have been featured in The Pocket Sandwich Theatre's recent production of Tearjerker, Cold Shoulder Productions' The Theory of Total Blame and, Deep Ellum Opera Theatre's The Mikado. Theatre Three productions include Always...Patsy Cline, Shadowlands, Ball Games!, DROOD!, Assassins and A Small Family Business.

LINDA BLASE, Lighting Design. Her association with Theatre Three began with Woman In Mind. Subsequent designs at Theatre Three include musicals, dramas and comedies in every season since that initial assignment. Ms. Blase is also an accomplished photographer and documents many of Dallas' dramatic productions.



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

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
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
