





CAST PROFILES

SONNY FRANKS (Luigi Gaudi) A native Texan, born and raised in Mesquite, he studied opera with Leonora Sergi at Southwest Texas State University. Having toured the globe with the New Christy Minstrels, he lives in Texas with his wife, Connie, and his two year old daughter, Hailey. Theatre credits include The Frogs, Cotton Patch Gospel Review, Always...Patsy Cline, West Side Story, The Best Little Whorehouse In Texas, A Little Night Music, Grease and Ball Games. Television credits include These Precious Days, America's Most Wanted, Heaven Help Us and, for PBS, Wishbone. He would like to join everyone here at Theatre Three in thanking all of you for your continued support of live theater in Dallas.

RICHARD FREDERICK (Man #2) Last seen in T3's production of The Frogs as, what else, a frog, among other things, his other T3 role was the shadow player in Mandragola while also understudying various roles in that production. Local credits include George in Lovers and Roger Doremus in Summer and Smoke (Moonstruck), Smokey in Damn Yankees (Theatre Arlington), Renfield in Count Dracula (Richardson) and Sipos in She Loves Me (Irving). He has studied at The Royal National Theater in London with the late Michael Joyce. Film credits include PBS' Wishbone and The Movie Channel's Enemy Gold.

BOB HESS (Man #1) is delighted to be making his first appearance at Theatre Three! He was most recently seen as The Ghost of Christmas Past in A Christmas Carol (Dallas Theater Center), Alfred/Sam in Romance, Romance (Lyric Theatre of Irving), and in the year-long run of Casa Manaña's Shear Madness as Lt. Tom O'Brien. A member of Casa's resident company for four seasons, his favorite roles there included Perchik in Fiddler on the Roof, Walter in Chess, Giles Ralston in The Mousetrap, Orin the Dentist in Little Shop of Horrors, Garry Roger in Noises Off and Rooster in Annie. He also works extensively in television, radio and industrial films, and can most recently be heard on radio singing his heart out about Zuzu's Mexican food!

DOUG JACKSON (Vinnie DiRuzzio) His T3 appearances include Randy in Ball Games, Seymour in Little Shop of Horrors, Harpo in A Day In Hollywood..., and Crisparkle in DROOD! Regional credits include Luther Billis in South Pacific with Cathy Rigby (Casa Manaña), Bogdanovich in The Merry Widow (TUTS in Houston), Littlechap in Stop The World..., A Comedy of Errors and Romeo and Juliet (Shakespeare Festival of Dallas), Guys and Dolls, Best Little Whorehouse..., Gypsy with Lainie Kazan, Oklahoma, Cotton Patch Gospel and Six Degrees of Separation and A Christmas Carol (Dallas Theater Center). He has done national commercials for Exxon, Radio Shack, Lucite Paint and Southwest Airlines; film credits include Murder in the Heartland, JFK and Mississippi Burning. A native Texan, Doug lives in Oak Cliff with his wife, actress Amy Mills, and two daughters, Emily and Abigail.

MICHAEL JUSTIS (Harry Witherspoon) just appeared as Shakespeare in The Frogs; other T3 appearances include Ball Games and Heartbeats. He has also been seen as Jimmy Powers in City of Angels (Casa Manaña); Chess and Damn Yankees (North Shore Music Theater, Beverly, MA); Evita (Theater Under the Stars, Houston); The Desert Song (Dallas Summer Musicals); Promenade (Manhattan Clearing House); Frederic in Pirates of Penzance; Danny in Baby; the Immigrant in Tintypes; Joseph in Joseph and the Amazing Technicolor Dreamcoat; and, Matt in The Fantasticks (Dallas Rep). This past October he appeared in "Quilt: A Musical Celebration" to benefit the Names Project AIDS Quilt.

GRETA MULLER (Woman #1) returns to T3 after appearances in A Day In Hollywood..., A Little Night Music and Festival of the Unfamiliar, when she sang with her vocal group, Howard and the Fine Sisters. Other stage work includes Das Barbequ (Dallas Theater Center); Dann Yankees (with Jamie Farr); Hello, Dolly (with Ruta Lee); Daddy's Dyin', Who's Got The Will? (Casa Manaña); and, Six Women with Brain Death (Moving Target and Dallas Rep). When not on stage, Greta is busy with broadcast work, television commercials, radio spots and industrial shows. She was a regular in the NBC sitcom, 13 East, and plays Miss Lenore, the Singing Librarian on PBS's Gerbert. Greta most recently played Cloris Leachman's best friend in the NBC made-for-tv movie, In Broad Daylight, and was seen just weeks ago as the white trash Bingo caller in an episode of Walker, Texas Ranger.

LIZ PIAZZA KELLEY(Woman #2) last appeared in A Christmas Carol (Dallas Theater Center). T3 credits include Judy in Manchild in the Promised Land; Winnie Ruth Judd in Tiger Lady; Isabelle/Celie's Maid in The School for Husbands/The Imaginary Cuckold; Tina in A Small Family Business; Emma Goldmanin Assassins; and, The Mute in The Fantasticks. Other favorite roles are Snookie in 110 in the Shade (Lyric Stage); Audrey in Little Shop of Horrors, directed by the late Rod Wilson; Susan in Carnal Knowledge; Lora in Stars in the Morning Sky; and, Victoria in Titanic (Moonstruck). A singer and dancer, she has worked as an entertainer on Regency Cruise Lines and is a classical flautist and graduate of PAMTC.

SALLY SOLDO (Rita La Porta) will be remembered by Theatre Three audiences for her performances in A...My Name Is Alice, You're Gonna Love Tomorrow, Angry Housewives, A Little Night Music, Assassins and Heartbeats. Other Dallas appearances include leading roles in A Chorus Line; I Do, I Do; The Sound of Music; The Unsinkable Molly Brown; Annie Get Your Gun; Guys and Dolls; and, Is There Life After High School? Regional credits include Off-Broadway in Up Eden with Blythe Danner; the national touring company of George M!; Play It Again, Sam (with Robert Morse); Baby (with Carol Lawrence and Larry Kert); The Odd Couple (with Tom Poston). A medical technologist at Parkland Memorial Hospital and currently in the Nursing program at El Centro College, she lives in Dallas with husband, Jon Veon, and son, Jonathan.

JEFFREY WATSON (Body of Uncle Anthony) an intern at Theatre Three since February '94, he was last seen as Mortimer (The Man Who Dies) in The Fantasticks and as Charon (Boatman of the River Styx) in The Frogs. With this production, playing all aspects of death is obviously his specialty. Other local roles include Max in Lend Me A Tenor, Charlie Brown in You're A Good Man, Charlie Brown, Victor in The Price, and Danny in Danny and the Deep Blue Sea. He did not die in any of these roles. Ending his internship at T3 with this production, he hopes to die in several productions thereafter. Thanks his parents, family and especially Leigh Anne Patterson for their love and support.

TABITHA WOODS (Annabel Glick) After finishing Fortinbras (as Ophelia) for T3, she participated in a long run at the Improvisation as a member of The Usual Suspects (an improv troupe). ARTISTIC STAFF

Jac Alder, Director, has, since co-founding Theatre Three in 1961, directed the majority of its musical presentations. Always interested in new works, he has served the last two years as the director/dramaturg for new musicals in the Northwood University Studio Program. Besides his interest in directing and developing musical works, Mr. Alder is particularly interested in classics, having directed works by Shaw, Shakespeare, Moliere and Goldoni. He directed and wrote the English language version of Machiavelli's Mandragola, the Theatre's third subscription show of this season. He just directed the Shevelove/Sondheim musical, The Frogs, as well as hosting a dialogue with Mr. Sondheim, who visited Theatre Three during his stay in Dallas to receive the Meadows Award. As Executive Producer-Director, he selects and assembles the artistic and administrative team that - working with the Theatre's Board - operates Theatre Three in its year-round service to Dallas and its visitors. Mr. Alder wishes to express his thanks to Jason Drummond for bringing this show, Lucky Stiff, to his attention.

Terry Dobson, Musical Director, has been associated with Theatre Three since 1980 as musical director and assistant to the producer. As musical director, he has been responsible for overforty musical productions, including last season's hit, Always...Patsy Cline, and for over ten Stephen Sondheim productions, including The Frogs, A Funny Thing...Forum, A Little Night Music, Assassins and Sweeney Todd. Terry is also the musical director for ENCORE! (the small group ensemble from the renowned Turtle Creek Chorale) and a free-lance pianist and arranger.

Vern McKinney, Technical Director, in his fourth season with Theatre Three, has acted, directed and designed numerous show, including Maniet, Dammit!; Vital Signs' H.M.S. Pinafore; Into The Woods; Sexual Perversity In Chicago; and, No Sex. Please, We're British.

Lyle Hucheson, Costume Designer. His most recent work was seen in the Actor's Stock Theater production of A Woman Of Independent Means. Other design credits include Spring Awakening (Lulu Theatricals), Suddenly Last Summer and Cymbeline (11th Street Theater Project) and Aladdin (Dallas Children's Theater). He has also designed hats and crafts for the Shakespeare Festival of Dallas and the Dallas Opera. Lyle received his training at the University of North Texas and is currently assistant costume designer at The Dallas Theater Center.

Linda Blase, Lighting Designer. Her association with Theater Three began with Woman In Mind. Subsequent designs at Theatre Three include musicals, dramas and comedies in every season since that initial assignment. Her latest addition to Theatre Three's holiday presentations, was the creation of O Tannenbaum.

J. Hall, Choreographer, is delighted to be "back with Jac" on Lucky Stiff after providing choreography for T3 productions of Assassins, DROOD! and Ball Games. Recent work includes direction/choreography for Sweet Charity and Seven Brides for Seven Brothers, plus numerous beauty industrials as owner/director of Freestyle Productions. Other choreography/director work includes Wilsonart Show and the Grand Prairie Summer Musicals. In his 15th year on faculty for Mountainview College, he is also a founding member of the Performing Artists' Musical Theatre Conservatory.

Steplunie Locker, Co-Choreographer, returns to T3 after serving as the assistant choreographer on DROOD! Tour credits include Casa Manaña productions of Chess, Damn Yankees and Fiddler On The Roof. Other credits include countless industrial shows plus choreography for the recent PAMTO production of A Chorus Line. A 4th year staff member at Mountainview College, she teaches and is rebuilding the children's weekend dance program.

Penny Sue Mauvais, Scenic Designer, earlier this season returned to Theatre Three after a 32 year absence. She was responsible for the still-remembered set for T3's 1962 production of Julius Caesar. Her interest in Roman forms (and forums!) began when she extensively photographed architectural remains of Roman ruins in Italy, Southern France and Northern Africa. The hobby turned into a profession with the publication of her treatise "Le Forum Romain et les Forums de Jules Caesar, D'August, De Vespasian, De Nerva et de Traja," which won her acclaim in her adopted city of Arles, France, and subsequently through the French Academy. She now lives with her husband Andre Mauvais (retired from his post as Chief Curator of the Musee de Jacques-Louis David) in Ms. Mauvais' paternal homestead in Euless.

Harland Wright, Scenic Painting. He design work as received the Dallas Theater Critics Forum Award twice: for The Road To Mecca and The Island of the Skog. 
