



PROFILE

RONNIE CLAIRE EDWARDS is a Theatre Three favorite. She's fondly remembered for her role in Sister Mary Ignatius Explains It All To You, which enjoyed packed houses during its extended run in 1988. Ms. Edwards originally appeared with Theatre Three during its "garage" days on Main Street in Lillian Hellman's Little Foxes and The Miracle Worker. Theatre Three audiences have also seen her in Patiol Porch.

Ms. Edwards is also known for her portrayal of the unforget-table Corabeth Godsey on The Waltons which ran for ten years on television. She was also a regular on the television series Sara, Boone, Just In Time and had a recurring role on Designing Women. She has guest starred on Star Trek: The Next Generation, Murder She Wrote, Crazy Like A Fox, Dynasty and Falcon Crest. Ms. Edwards' film credits include All The Way Home, Nobody's Fool, The 34th Star (opposite Richard Kiley), Perfect, The Dead Pool, When Every Day Was The Fourth of July, UFO Cafe and 8 Seconds (with Luke Perry).

Ms. Edwards began her career when she won the Margo Jones Protégé Award at the famed Margo Jones Theatre. She appeared there in fifteen original plays as well as classic plays. She was a recipient for a Ford Foundation Grant at The Cleveland Playhouse where she received rave reviews as Blanche in A Streetcar Names Desire and Elenya in Uncle Vanya. She played Violet in Man and Superman, Andromache in Tiger at the Gates, the Stepdaughter in Six Characters In Search Of An Author as well as five other roles at Washington, D.C.'s Arena Stage.

Macbeth, Cia in As You Desire Me and Julia in The Rivals. She played Truvy in the highly successful Pasadena Playhouse production of Steel Magnolias. Ms. Edwards has had leading roles at the San Diego Old Globe, The Actor's Theatre of Louisville, Cincinnati's Playhouse in the Park, The Los Angeles Theatre Center, Los Angeles' Mark Taper Forum, the Williamstown Theatre, and the Berkshire Summer Festival. Her many roles include Mary Tyrone in Long Day's Journey Into Night, Jean in The Prime of Miss Jean Brody, Katherine in The Taming of the Shrew, Maggle in Cat On A Hot Tin Roof, Miss Adelaide in Guys and Dolls, Regina in The Little Foxes, Annie Sullivan in The Miracle Worker, the title role in Sister Mary Ignatius Explains It All To You, Anna in Old Times and Bananas in The House of Blue Leaves.

Her Broadway appearances include *Patio/Porch*, which she later produced and starred in both at Theatre Three and in Los Angeles. She is the co-author of the musical *Cowboy* based on the life of the Western painter, Charles Russell, which was originally produced at the Goodspeed Opera House, later on Off-Broadway and then toured nine states. Ms. Edwards has received three Dramalogue Awards for excellence in acting.

The Knife Thrower's Assistant or A Life On The Cutting Edge was written by Ms. Edwards and she is currently performing it across the United States. Her performance sites include the Clinton/Gore Inaugural Festival, The National Cowboy Hall of Fame and the 1993 Edinburgh International Festival Fringe where she was awarded a "Fringe Best" award.

Theatre Three is pleased to have Ms. Edwards return to present its first Premium Performance of the 94/95 Season.



On stage, Mr. Randolph had a three year run of Greater Tuna in San Francisco, which was also later performed at the Edinburgh Festival Fringe. He recently appeared in the film Chaplin, television's Beverly Hills 90210 and The Tonlght Show With Jay Leno. He had a running role on the television series Hotel and has also appeared on Columbo, Who's The Boss, Get A Life and The Good Time Cafe on the Arts and Entertainment Network. At Theatre Three, he appeared as the Judge in The Traveling Lady.

GINGER PERKINS, *Producer* - had produced theatre in Los Angeles, Salt Lake City, Aberdeen, Scotland and for the past ten years at the Edinburgh Festival Fringe. Ms. Perkins runs her own film and television production company, Frantic Redhead productions as well as acting as personal manger for actors and writers. She also carries out a consultancy role on behalf of independence production companies in Los Angeles and non-profit arts organizations such as the U.S. Film Festival, Ballet West, Compania de Teatro Bilingue and various university theatres. Ms. Perkins has taught in the Arts Administration program at the University of Utah, serves as Assistant Executive Director of the Utah Endowment for the Humanities and on the Board of Directors of the national organization, Women in Theatre.

WILLIAM J. IMMERMAN, **Producer** - currently works as an independent film producer and entertainment attorney in Los Angeles. He has recently produced Where The Red Fern Grows Part II, Mind Games, Primal Rage, and Welcome To Spring Break. His other producing credits include Southern Comfort, Take This Job and Shove It and Hysterical. Mr. Immerman was Director of Business Affairs at American International Pictures, Senior Vice President of Twentieth Century Fox, Chairman of the Board and President of Cinema Group, Vice Chairman of Pathe's subsidiary company. Cannon Pictures, Inc. He is a member of the Academy of Motion Pictures Arts and Sciences.





As an actor, he was last seen at Three Below in Mammet, Dammit! His most recent design work includes Vital Signs, H.M.H. Pinafore and Into The Woods. Mr. McKinney has directed The Woods, Sexual Perversity In Chicago, No Sex Please, We're British and Grandma Duck Is Dead. In 1992 Mr. McKinney and Mark Hadley began the New Artists Theatre Company. Their next production is John Brown's Body.

DEIDRE MOSER, Costumes, is starting her third season at Theatre Three. Ms. Moser's costume designs have been featured in The Pocket Sandwich Theatre's recent production of Tearjerker, Cold Shoulder Productions' The Theory of Total Blame and, Deep Ellum Opera Theatre's The Mikado. Theatre Three productions include Always...Patsy Cline, Shadowlands, Ball Games!, DROOD!, Assassins and A Small Family Business.

MARK HANKLA, Lighting Design. The Knife Thrower's Assistant is Mr. Hankla's second design assignment for Theatre Three, having designed the recent children's production Tumbleweed Theatricals. He is a recent graduate of the College of William and Mary in Williamsburg, VA and a recent arrival to the Dallas area. Mr. Hankla is also an actor and was seen last season in Theatre Three's productions of Shadowlands and The Fantasticks.

Penny Sue Mauvais, Set Design, returns for a Theatre Three assignment after a thirty-two year absence. She was responsible for the still-remembered set for Theatre Three's 1962 production of Julius Caesar. Her interest in Roman forms (and forums!) began when she extensively photographed architectural remains of Roman ruins in Italy, Southern France and Northern Africa. The hobby turned into a profession with the publication of her treatise "Le Forum Romain et les Forums de Jules Caesar, d'Auguste, de Vespasian, de Nerva et de Traja" which won her acclaim in her adopted city of Arles, France and, subsequently through the French Academy. Ms. (or Mlle.) Mauvais has known Ms. Ronnie Claire Edwards since tutoring Ms. Edwards in foreign language classes at Classen High School in Oklahoma City. Returning to America, she now lives with her husband Andre Mauvais (retired from his post as Chief Curator of the Musee de Jacques-Louis David) in Ms. Mauvais' paternal homestead in Euliss.




