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



He received both Academy Award and Writers Guild nominations for THE TRIP TO BOUNTIFUL and Geraldine Page received an Academy Award for Best Actress. Both he and Miss Page received the Independent Feature Project West "Indie" awards for best screen play and best actress. Four of his films were shot on location in southeast Texas: LILY DALE, THE WIDOW CLAIRE, CONVICTS, and ROOTS IN A PARCHED GROUND. playwright and director, he has had many plays produced on Broadway, Off-Broadway, and Off-Off-Broadway. CHERYL DENSON (Director for THE TRAVELING LADY) made her Theatre Three directing debut with last season's holiday hit production of THE FANTASTICKS and recently directed the Jones/Schmidt classic for the second time. Dallas audiences have seen her directing work in BROADWAY BOUND, a hit at Dallas Repertory Theatre, and PULP AND CIRCUMSTANCE at Theatre Gemini. Cheryl has also directed at Dallas Theater Center and New Arts Theatre and has designed sets and/or costumes for many Theatre Three productions, including the acclaimed setting for THE ROAD TO MECCA (with Harland Wright), the garden setting for WOMAN IN MIND, and the speakeasy-backstage for BROADWAY. Her acting appearances include such hits as SAFETY and TOP GIRLS. Cheryl has served as Theatre Three's Production Manager since the Fall of 1983.

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**TERRY** TITTLE HOLMAN (*Production Stage Manager*) joined Theatre Three for the 1987-88 Season. She has been a stage manager for over 14 years and has worked with Dallas Ballet, Plaza Theatre, Mansion Dinner Theatre, Theatre Memphis, and Theatre Midland. LINDA BLASE (Lighting Design) has designed lighting for more than 25 productions at Dallas Theater Center as well as Theatre Three's recent productions of THE ROAD TO MECCA, THE FANTASTICKS, NOTHING SACRED, and WOMAN IN MIND. During the 88-89 season Linda designed lighting for Dallas Repertory Theatre's BROADWAY BOUND and A SHAYNA MAIDEL, Callier Theatre's THE HAUNTING OF HILL HOUSE, and designed lighting and sound for TO KILL A MOCKINGBIRD at Dallas Children's Theater. She teaches an advanced lighting class at Dallas Arts Magnet High School.

**NELSON COATES** (*Set Design*) recently designed scenery for the Universal movie, *PROBLEM CHILD*, starring John Ritter. He served as Production Designer for The Family Channel's series, *GERBERT*. Last year he served as Art Director for *MOTHER'S DAY*, a movie of the week starring Malcolm-Jamal Warner, Joe Ferrer, and Melba Moore, and designed the movie *FOR JENNY WITH LOVE*. His work has been seen Off-Broadway and most recently in *A SHAYNA MAIDEL* at Dallas Repertory Theatre and Moving Target Theatre's *THREE POSTCARDS* and *TALES OF THE LOST FORMICANS*. His company, N Productions, is involved in entertainment-related design and film/video production.

CHRISTOPHER KOVARIK (Costume Design) has designed numerous productions at Theatre Three, including THE ROAD TO MECCA and such personal favorites as TAKING STEPS, THE MIDDLE OF NOWHERE, and BROADWAY. Chris has worked at other Dallas theatres and is an active S.T.A.G.E. member.

**TRISTAN WILSON** (Sound Design) is in his fourth season at Theatre Three, where he designed and installed a new sound system for the theatre. He is married to actress Peggy Pharr Wilson.

NORMA YOUNG (Founding/Artistic Director) was born in Dallas, reared in Oak Cliff, and educated at Sul Ross State University in Alpine (which gave her its Distinguished Ex-Student Award in 1982). Ms. Young's career took her to Houston and New York before she returned to Dallas to found Theatre Three in 1961. She has served as Theatre Three's Artistic Director continuously since then. In addition to her extensive directing credits (most recently THE ROAD TO MECCA), Ms. Young has played many leading roles at Theatre Three and made guest appearances around Texas and in many film and television projects.

JAC ALDER (Executive Producer-Director) co-founded Theatre Three with Norma Young, Robert Dracup, and Ester Ragland in 1961. Born and educated in Okiahoma, Alder was Director of Drama at the University of Texas at Arlington during the '70s. His extensive service to the theatre includes work with DISD's PACE organization, the Theater Panel of the Texas Commission on the Arts, Dallas Arts Combine, Dallas Arts Coalition, Dallas Symphony Orchestra, Texas Non-Profit Theatres, and many others. Alder has been cited by the Dallas Theater Critics Forum and, with Norma Young, received the Dallas Historical Society Award for Excellence in Creative Arts.

LAURENCE O'DWYER (Associate Director) has directed such Theatre Three hits as LITTLE SHOP OF HORRORS, ANIMAL FARM, MA RAINEY'S BLACK BOTTOM, A LUV MUSICAL, and LIGHT UP THE SKY. His many acting appearances include NOTHING SACRED, A QUARREL OF SPARROWS, and THE WALTZ OF THE TOREADORS. Larry created Theatre Three's Grimm Magician Players and is currently directing TUMBLEWEED THEATRICALS for the theatre. Larry's acclaimed guest appearance as Fistula in Dallas Theater Center's TEMPTATION precedes his upcoming starring role in Theatre Three's A FUNNY THING HAPPENED ON THE WAY TO THE FORUM.

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
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
