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=BACKGROUNDS

The Actors

SCOTT BRADFORD will be remembered by Theatre Three audiences for his singing and dancing work in last summer's A DAY IN HOLLYWOOD, A NIGHT IN THE UKRAINE. Studying at the prestigious Indiana University School of Music, Mr. Bradford was seen in such roles as the Emcee in CABARET and Leading Player in PIPPIN. Professionally, Mr. Bradford has completed national tours of A CHRISTMAS CAROL (Peter Cratchet) and THE 1940'S RADIO HOUR (B. J. Gibson). He has also toured in the title role of Wiley in Susan Zeder's renowned children's play WILEY AND THE HAIRY MAN. His Sondheim credits include Henrick in A LITTLE NIGHT MUSIC starring D'Jamin Bartlett. Mr. Bradford is currently a member of Terry Dobson's vocal jazz group Central Expressway.

Dobson's vocal jazz group Central Expressway. KIM FARMER-KASSIRA was last seen by Theatre Three audiences in last season's production of CHARLOTTE SWEET, playing the role of Skitsu Scoffield. She has since been involved in extensive studio recording at Dallas' Studio Southwest where she is produced by executive engineer John Early and former Doobie Brothers drummer Mike Hossack. She returned in the fall of 1983 from a year-long travel with the national touring company of HELLO DOLLY!, starring Carol Channing, in which she understudied the role of Ernestina. Miss Kassira made her professional theatre debut at the age of 14 in the Dallas Junior Players Guild and has since acquired a resume of leading musical comedy and operatic roles. Some of these roles include Molly Brown in the UNSINKABLE MOLLY BROWN, Annie Oakley in ANNIE GET YOUR GUN, Dolly Levi in HELLO DOLLY!, Bloody Mary in SOUTHPACIFIC and Zita in GIANNISCHICCI. Aside from pursuing her theatre and recording careers, she is also in the process of opening her own dinner-showroom called - what else? - Kassira's. RICHARD ROLLIN is making his first appearance at Theatre Three. Following twenty years of teaching and public administration, he attained a lifelong goal to work in the theatre. He lists among his many credits roles as Jesus in JESUS CHRIST SUPERSTAR, Larry in COMPANY, Truscott in THE RULING CLASS and the uncle in TELL TALE HEART. In addition to these roles performed in Austin, he has played various ensemble roles in PAINT YOUR WAGON, THE MUSIC MAN and MARAT SADE. Mr. Rollin appeared first in Dallas as Frank Butler in the 1980 production ANNIE GET YOUR GUN at the Country Dinner Playhouse. He has just completed his third season with the Dallas Opera Chorus. Mr. Rollin studies dance, voice and acting and currently makes his home in Dallas.

SALLY SOLDO made her first appearance at Theatre Three in this season's opening production ANGRY HOUSEWIVES. Dallas audiences will remember her as Linda Christie in PLAY IT AGAIN, SAM opposite Robert Morse and as Maria in THE SOUND OF MUSIC at the Country Dinner Playhouse, as well as Miss Hannigan in ANNIE, Sarah in GUYS AND DOLLS and Agnes in I DO! I

DO! at the Dallas Repertory Theatre. Recently, she starred in THEY'RE PLAYING OUR SONG in Galveston and has appeared regionally in Stephen Sondheim's A LITTLE NIGHT MUSIC. Miss Soldo's wide experience includes the national tour of GEORGE M!, playing Ethel Levey opposite Tony Tanner, Off-Broadway, night club revues, broadcast and films, as well as being an accomplished dancer and choreographer. Ms. Soldo makes her home in Dallas and Houston with her husband Jon Veon and two-year-old son Jonathan Justin.

The Director

JAC ALDER, along with Norma Young, was one of the theatre's original founders and remains the theatre's Executive Producer-Director. Trained as an architect (his degree is from Oklahoma University), he designed Theatre Three's unique space. Mr. Alder serves as an officer for the Dallas Arts Combine, as a member of DISD's Partnership of Arts and Culture in Education Committee and its Magnet Arts High School, Chairman of the Theatre Panel of the Texas Commission on the Arts and consultant to Western Arts Foundation. Last season, Mr. Alder appeared in SCHOOL FOR WIVES and directed CHARLOTTE SWEET and the very popular SISTER MARY IGNATIUS EXPLAINS IT ALL FOR YOU and its reprise. He has most recently completed the directorial assignment for Bernard Shaw's classic ARMS AND THE MAN.

The Musical Director

TERRY DOBSON has been associated with Theatre Three for the past six years as musical director, actor and all-around "good guy." He was heard from earlier this season as Musical Director/pianist for ANGRY HOUSEWIVES and was seen onstage last season as Madame Pavlenko in A DAY IN HOLLYWOOD, A NIGHT IN THE UKRAINE and as the lovable Leon in THE WAKE OF JAMEY FOSTER (for which he was nominated by the Dallas Times Herald as Best Supporting Actor in the 1983-84 Dallas theatre season). Recently, he completed an assignment as musical director for BABY at Dallas Repertory Theatre. Mr. Dobson is also the founder and musical director for the popular Dallas vocal group Central Expressway. He teaches music at the Dallas Theater Center.

The Playwright



York City-born Sondheim also lists among his credits the lyrics for WEST SIDE STORY, GYPSY and DO I HEAR A WALTZ?, but his talents and credits are not confined to the stage — he coauthored the movie "The Last of Sheila" with Anthony Perkins and created the background score for the Alain Resnais film "Stravisky." Mr. Sondheim earned two degrees from Williams College. His earlier education was taken at the Ethical Cultural School and the Fieldston School in New York and a military academy at Cornwall-on-Hudson. He is past president of The Dramatists Guild.

The Artistic Director

NORMA YOUNG founded Theatre Three in 1960. along with Jac Alder, Bob Dracup and Esther Ragland, and currently serves as Artistic Director. She directed Theatre Three's ROSENCRANTZ & GUILDENSTERN ARE DEAD and SCHOOL FOR WIVES last season. She has recently appeared in several films and television movies, including LICENSE TO KILL and the mini-series CELEBRITY. Her most recent film credit is Robert Benton's newly-released PLACES IN THE HEART. The recent Theatre Three production of FOXFIRE marked Miss Young's return to the Theatre Three stage after a two year absence. Miss Young is married to Jac Alder, the theatre's Executive Producer-Director. This year marks her 40th year in the theatre.

The Designers

KEN HUDSON (Lighting Designer) made his Theatre Three debut with FOXFIRE and QUARTERMAINE'S TERMS. Mr. Hudson's previous designs in Dallas have included ON THE RAZZLE for New Arts Theatre, A MURDER IS ANNOUNCED, BEOWULF and A CHRISTMAS CAROL for the Dallas Theater Center, as well as opera and dance programs for area universities and community theatres. Other work includes costume design for HANSEL AND GRETHEL in the Dallas Theater Center's Magic Turtle Series, technical direction and co-lighting design for COTTON PATCH GOSPEL at the Biblical Arts Center, scenery construction for theatrical, industrial and video productions, as well as acting. Mr. Hudson received his B.A. from East Texas State University and his M.F.A. from Trinity University.

ALICE CAMILLE McCLEILAN (Costume Designer) studied fabric design and fashion merchandising at the University of Alabama. She is a veteran costumer of many plays and operas. Her design credits include THE WIZARD OF OZ, THE SORROWS OF STEPHEN (presented last year at the New Arts Theatre) and the East Texas outdoor drama BEYOND THE SUNDOWN. Theatre costume design is one of the many facets of apparel she has been known to create.

MICHAEL G. MOYNIHAN (Scenic Designer, in association with Jac Alder) graduated with a B.A. in Theatre from Centre College of Kentucky and has recently studied at the Dallas Theater Center. He has designed settings for THE LITTLE PRINCE and AS YOU LIKE IT at the Dallas Theater Center and SWEET CHARITY, I DO, I DO, MACBETH and TWO BY TWO in Savannah, Georgia. He created lighting designs for the "Georgia Day Pageant" for Historic Savannah Foundation, as well as YOU CAN'T TAKE IT WITH YOU at Savannah Little Theatre, IDO, IDO at Savannah Summer Theatre and THE WIND IN THE WILLOWS at the Dallas Theater Center. His most recent lighting design was for Theatre Three's production of ARMS AND THE MAN.

SUSIE THENNES (Assistant Costume Designer) is the Costume Construction and Wardrobe Supervisor for Theatre Three. Her work was last seen on Theatre Three's stage in the designing of costumes for FOXFIRE and QUARTERMAINE'S TERMS. She assisted in the costume design for ARMS AND THE MAN, OUTSIDE WACO, ANGRY HOUSEWIVES and A DAY IN HOLLYWOOD, A NIGHT IN THE UKRAINE. Ms. Thennes' biography appears in The Women of '85, a book by and about Texas women. Outside the theatre, she amuses herself by researching and collecting international folk costumes.







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
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
